



Call for Applications: Research Ethicist in Technology Ethics

Topos Institute is searching for a Research Ethicist to help craft and develop a deeply rooted culture of ethical, prosocial scientific and technological research, both internally and in the broader ecosystem. Topos is a new nonprofit scientific institute with a mission to shape technology for public benefit by advancing sciences of connection and integration. Our team of 12 uses cutting-edge mathematics to develop computational tools that enhance communication, cooperation, and collective intelligence (example), with careful attention to their ethical, prosocial deployment. We have raised over \$7M and are doubling in size annually. We now seek a motivated, independent team member to help shape the ethical culture of our ambitious research institute directly in its most formative stages.

Position Summary

- The Research Ethicist will be the pioneer who builds and develops new cultural practices in research and development (R&D) at Topos, to further deepen engagement with the ethical and societal impacts of our fundamental, technological research. We believe that more ethical and responsible technology R&D requires innovation in R&D practices and processes, including in basic R&D that may initially seem at arms length from application. The new Research Ethicist will engage with the team to lead these transformative efforts at Topos, with the ultimate goal of leading new R&D sector best practice.
- The Research Ethicist will collaborate closely with fellow Topos scientists, including on reviews of ethical implications of existing and potential research projects; development of research and governance processes and practices; building a culture of ethical and societal reflection in our research and team; and application of their essential expertise across the organization. While the primary focus is on internal expertise and practices at Topos, publication through academic and/or popular channels is also a key aspect of the role.
- The salary range for this position is \$70,000 to \$90,000, with generous benefits. It is a two year full-time position, with possibility of extension, and located at our offices in Berkeley, California.

Topos believes in the value that diverse perspectives and life experiences bring to our community, and we especially welcome applications from those with personal or professional backgrounds underrepresented in our present team. We are dedicated to shaping the future of technology to ensure a more equitable and just world, and believe that technology to support a healthy society can only be built by an inclusive organization.

Position Responsibilities

- Collaborate with Topos staff scientists to illuminate ethical and societal implications of existing and proposed research projects, including broader issues of fairness, autonomy, responsibility, and care.
- Collaborate with Topos' broader stakeholders, including the board of directors and principal donors, to align our ethical culture.
- Help explore and provide guidance regarding new, prosocial applications of our mathematical and software tools, including design, implementation, and partnership choices that facilitate those applications.
- Participate in the development of Topos organizational policy on topics including research management; diversity, equity and inclusion; gift and grant acceptance; and outside engagements, with a view to advancing new industry standards.
- Bring expertise in technology ethics to our team through seminars, facilitated discussions, and staff training, including helping Topos staff think concretely about abstract projects and the people that are impacted.
- Facilitate links between the Topos community and wider technology ethics community.
- Pursue novel scholarship on ethical practice in fundamental mathematical, scientific, and technological research.

Qualifications

- A PhD in a field related to technology and ethics (or equivalent), and at least one year of experience in a scientific research context.
- Exceptional communication, facilitation, and interpersonal skills, ideally combined with experience in establishing the culture of early-stage organizations. Diverse cultural experiences are a plus; understanding of marginalization is essential.
- Ambitious work ethic and commitment to bringing about social change via the mission of the Topos Institute.
